

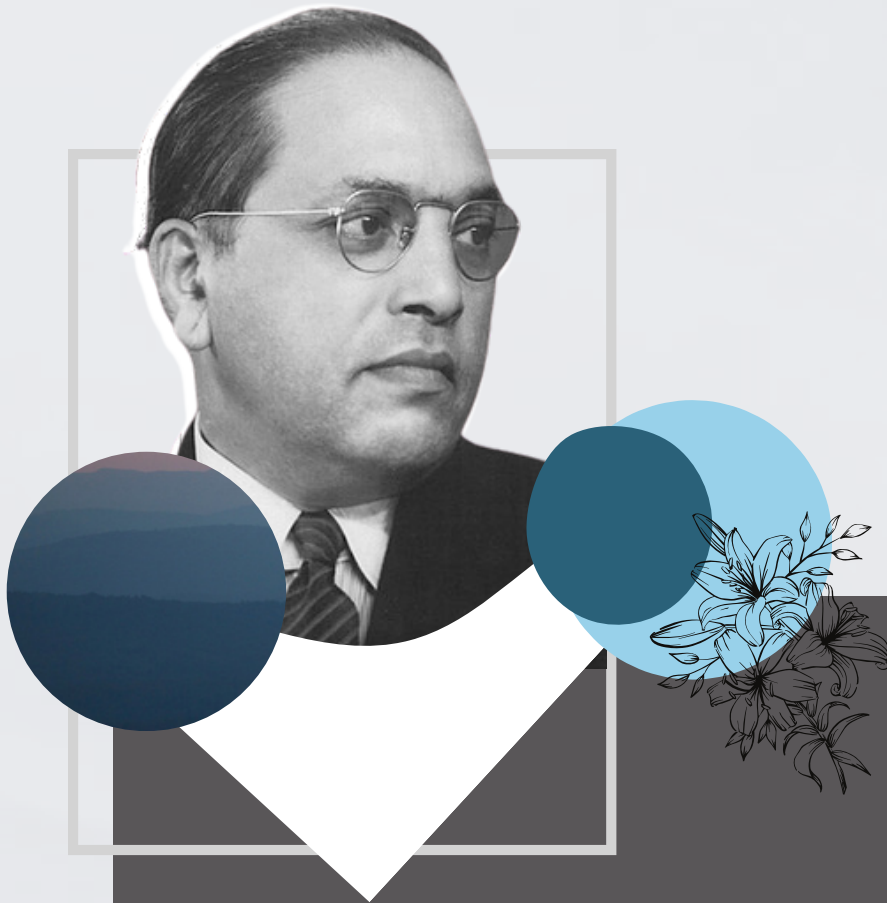

A vision realized: Recognizing the need for an esteemed institution dedicated to economic education based in Karnataka, the state government established the Bengaluru Dr. B. R. Ambedkar School of Economics in 2017.

Following the recommendations of a committee led by Shri. S. V. Ranganath, the government allocated ₹350 crores and 43.45 acres within the Jnana Bharathi Campus of Bangalore University for the School's establishment. Initially registered under the Karnataka Societies Registration Act (1960), the School's foundation stone was laid by then-President **Shri Pranab Mukherjee** in 2017, in the presence of the then Chief Minister Shri Siddaramaiah marking the 125th birth anniversary of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar.

The inaugural batch of B.Sc. (Honours) Economics commenced studies in August 2017, following an all-India entrance exam conducted by the Karnataka Examination Authority. The University's academic session was formally inaugurated by former Prime Minister - **Dr. Manmohan Singh** in October 2017.

In a significant development, Bengaluru Dr. B. R. Ambedkar School of Economics transitioned to a Unitary University as Dr. B. R. Ambedkar School of Economics University, Bengaluru under the Government of Karnataka in 2019, focusing on Economics and allied disciplines

Honoring Dr. B. R. Ambedkar's legacy, Prime Minister **Shri Narendra Modi** unveiled a statue of the visionary leader at the University campus on 20th June, 2022. He also inaugurated the newly built campus, emphasizing its potential to benefit countless students.

ACADEMIC ASPIRATIONS

The University boasts a vibrant student body of 310 enrolled across the 2-year MSc Economics, 2-year MSc Financial Economics, and the 5-year Integrated MSc Economics programs (as per NEP*). Our PhD program is poised to launch soon, further expanding our academic offerings. Admission opportunities extend beyond national borders, welcoming Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) and Foreign Nationals since 2021-22, with an additional intake of 5 students per program.

Our aspiration is to be recognized globally as a premier institution for economic education. We aim to not only set a new standard for teaching and research but also actively contribute to policy formulation by the Government of Karnataka, other state governments, the Government of India, and other international institutions in policy formulation. We believe in nurturing well-rounded economists with a holistic understanding of the discipline. Our curriculum integrates knowledge from social sciences like Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, and Philosophy, while fostering linguistic competence through foreign language electives like German and French. Instruction prioritizes critical analysis and open dialogue, allowing for the continuous exchange of fresh ideas and challenging of established thought.

Our core curriculum emphasizes strong quantitative skills through comprehensive training in all primary Economics courses. Additional mandatory courses like Computer Fundamentals, Constitutional Economics, and Social and Economic Thoughts of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, programming with R and Python, enrich the foundational knowledge base.

We empower students with the freedom to think critically and engage with diverse schools of thought. A rich selection of elective courses like Economics of Heritage, Natural Resource Analytics, Economic Journalism, Entrepreneurship Development, Economics of Climate Change, Application in Machine Learning and Artificial Intelligence, Trading Strategies, Financial Modelling etc allows students to tailor their learning towards their chosen career paths, be it in academia, corporate, public policy, or data analytics.

VICE CHANCELLOR

Prof N R Bhanumurthy took charge as the first Vice-Chancellor in June 2020. He is on leave from NIPFP, New Delhi, where he has been a Professor since 2009. He also worked as an Assistant Professor and Associate Professor at the Institute of Economic Growth.

His research areas are macro-monetary economics, fiscal policy, international money and finance, macroeconomic modelling, and development economics. In these areas, he has authored over 80 research papers and five books. He has had brief stints at several international developmental organisations and served in over 25 Government and Semi-Government Committees.

At the national level, currently he is serving on the Advisory Committee on National Accounts Statistics constituted by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation; 'High-Level Committee on Monitoring and Evaluation' by the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India; and the Research Advisory Committee, Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI).

He has received two prestigious awards: Mahalanobis Memorial Medal (National) Award for the year 2014 for his outstanding contributions to the field of quantitative economics in India; and VKRV Rao Prize in Social Sciences (Economics) for the year 2015, for high quality research and significant contributions to social science research in India.

STUDENT CORNER

University students are from different parts of the country who pursue various academic disciplines, engaging extracurricular activities, and learn to balance Academic and social life challenges. They contribute to a diverse campus community and typically work toward obtaining a degree in their chosen field. Students attend lectures, participate in discussions, conduct research, and often engage in various clubs. The University experience involves not only academic growth but also personal and social development. Given the applied nature of the course, students are required to carry their own laptops.

Many undergraduate dissertations are already published. This is apart from the conference presentations made by the students of the University in prestigious national conferences like TIES 2023 (The Indian Econometric Society) Annual Conference.

Several competitions were held as part of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' in essay writing, painting, patriotic singing and the Marathon.

As part of extracurricular activities students with talent and skills need to be provided with a venue to express themselves and excel. In this direction, their pursuits require to be appropriately guided toward logical ends by faculty members. In pursuance of such an initiative few clubs catering to the interests/aspirations of students are being established/set up in the University.

The student-run clubs of the University are Debate, Dance, Quiz, Design and Photography club, Environment Club, Behavioural Economics Society Club, Research Society Club, Book Club, Theatre Club to train the students and explore their skills, and talent to attend several state-level and national level events/competitions. Our students have won many prizes in national-level intercollegiate festivals, talent hunts and research competitions. SUMMER INTERNSHIPS & PLACEMENTS 2023-24

The University believes in nurturing not just academic excellence, but also industry-ready graduates equipped to confidently navigate the professional landscape. This commitment is embodied by the dynamic and dedicated Training and Placement Office (TPO), a bridge connecting students with their career aspirations.

The TPO equips students with the tools and confidence to excel in campus recruitment. Intensive training sessions hone essential skills across areas like aptitude tests, group discussions, technical interviews, and HR interactions by experts from the Industry. These sessions are proficiently delivered by seasoned mentors, providing students with invaluable insights and practical strategies.

The TPO fosters strong partnerships with renowned companies across diverse sectors. By actively understanding company needs and recruitment processes, the TPO facilitates seamless campus placement drives and internship opportunities.

The TPO's dedication reflects in its stellar achievements. The 2021-22, MSc Economics batch saw an impressive 95.2% final placement rate within the first season, further bolstered by a 100% internship placement rate. **The second batch of MSc Economics (2022-23) recorded a 93% campus placement.** Students secured placements in organizations like EY, CRISIL, Grant Thornton, Landmark Group, Varahe Analytics, Kantar, Tech Mahindra, Athena Infonomics etc.

The highest remuneration offered to our students was 12 lakhs per annum and the average remuneration offered to our students was 8 lakhs per annum in the past academic year

ENTRANCE AND COURSE DETAILS - 2024-25

Academic Programs Offered:

- Five-year Integrated M.Sc. Economics as per NEP 2020 [75 seats for Indian candidates + 5 seats for PIO/Foreign Nationals]
- Two-year M.Sc. Economics (30 seats for Indian candidates + 5 seats for PIO/Foreign Nationals)
- Two-year M.Sc. Financial Economics (30 seats for Indian candidates + 5 seats for PIO/Foreign Nationals)

Admission Eligibility:

Five-year Integrated M.Sc. Economics - NEP 2020*

For admission to the five-year integrated M.Sc. Economics programme, candidates should have passed in 12th Std/2nd PUC / Equivalent Exam with English as one of the Languages and Mathematics as a core subject and obtained a minimum of 65% marks (60% for SC/ST) in aggregate.

Two-year M.Sc. Economics & Two-year M.Sc. Financial Economics - NEP 2020*

For admission to our two-year M.Sc. programmes, Candidates should have completed B.Sc. (Honours)/B. A (Honours) in Economics or B.Sc./ B.A in Economics with Mathematics and Statistics/Econometrics as major courses in the degree with a minimum of 55% (50% for SC/ST) in aggregate.)

Important Note: -

- Admissions to all the programs offered at this University for the year 2024-25 are based on the Common Universities Entrance Test (CUET) 2024 to be conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) for both UG and PG programs.
- Application for all the courses will be available at the NTA website <https://cuetsamarth.ac.in>. It is compulsory to fill out the application at the NTA website and **opt for Dr. B.R. Ambedkar School of Economics University as one of the preferences in the NTA-CUET application.**
- While filling out the CUET UG Application to this University, Please select the test pattern as English and General Test.
- While filling out the CUET PG Application to this University, please select test paper code COQP10 for both the PG courses mentioned above.

- In addition to filling out the CUET forms, the applicants also compulsorily fill out our university application available at www.base.ac.in as and when we notify.

Selection Procedure:

- Candidates are required to fill in a Common University Entrance Test (CUET) 2024 online application form and appear for the test conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). For details on test schedules, syllabus and other information please visit <https://cuetsamarth.ac.in/>.
- Admissions to the above-mentioned courses are based on performance in CUET 2024 and as per the eligibility criteria and reservation roster. The selection process for the PIO/ Foreign National is based on the merit list of the performance in the respective qualifying examination(as per merit of 2nd PUC/12th Standard/Equivalent examination for UG admissions, and as per of UG aggregate for PG admissions).

*We follow the guidelines of Government of Karnataka on NEP. Any changes in this regard shall be implemented accordingly.

Reservation of seats:

1. 60% seats are reserved for students of Karnataka and the remaining 40% seats are open for students of all states including Karnataka.
2. Of the total 60% Karnataka seats 20% seats are reserved for SC category and 10% seats are reserved for ST category as per the orders of Government of Karnataka.
3. For Karnataka Category seats(60%) other OBC reservation (including 371(J)) would be adopted as per the norms.
4. Detailed Reservation roster of all three courses is available at the university website, www.base.ac.in
5. In addition to the above-mentioned seats, 5 seats are reserved for persons of Indian origin (PIO) and foreign nationals for each of the three programmes listed above.

FEE STRUCTURE

1. The fee is nominal when compared with other institutes and universities.
2. **The details of the fee structure for the Five-year Integrated M.Sc. Economics course, two-year M.Sc. Economics course and Two-year M.Sc. Financial Economics course for the year 2024-25 would be available at the University website www.base.ac.in**
3. **Note:** The fee Refund Policy for the students who want to withdraw their seat after admission will be as per UGC policy.
4. The Fee structure is subject to revision based on the University and shall be notified through separate notification.

SCHOLARSHIPS / FELLOWSHIPS

1. Scholarships: University shall facilitate the scholarship applications of the reserved category and minority students of Karnataka by providing them the required AISHE (All India Survey on Higher Education) Code, which is necessary during online application in the State Scholarship Portal and National Scholarship Portal respectively
2. Exim Bank would provide scholarship for 3 meritorious students from the two-year M.Sc. Economics final year. The Exim Bank-BASEU Scholarship will be offered to two meritorious students along with another scholarship for the topper among the reserved category (SC/ST/OBC) students, based on the performance of the students in their first year. Scholarship amount would be 5,000/- per month per student.

UNIVERSITY MOU'S / COLLABORATIONS

One of the aims of this university is to initiate collaborative teaching and research that helps public policy, industry as well as academia, during the last one year, our university has formally signed Memorandum of Understanding with some leading institutions. Currently, the university signed MoUs with the National Law School of India University, Manipal Academy of Higher Education, Atal Bihari Vajpayee Institute of Good Governance (Government of Madhya Pradesh), Standing Committee on Public Sector Enterprises (SCOPE), NSE Academy, KAS Officers Association and Infosys Springboard. Under these MoUs, the University is already engaged in joint teaching as well as research that is relevant for the curriculum as well as to public policy. Recently, the University signed its first International MoU with Financial University, Russia for research and academic collaboration.

THE HALLS OF RESIDENCE

University offers only full-time residential programmes. Residing on campus enables students to widen their horizons and acquire important interpersonal skills. There are separate girls' and boys' hostel blocks on the campus.

Students are each provided with a cot, cupboard, chair and a table. They are advised to bring their mattresses, curtains and bed linen. Hostels have a 24-hour running hot water facility. Laundry facilities are also available in the hostels. As Bengaluru experiences cold weather during November-January, students are advised to bring blankets and warm clothing.

The Halls of Residence have a common-room area for each floor and facilities for indoor games. To ensure an uninterrupted power supply, the Halls of Residence have their generators. Facilities of the public call office (PCO) and 24-hour security are some of the other features that ensure that students enjoy basic amenities and security so that they can focus on their studies.

The Halls of Residence Rules and Regulations are shared at the beginning of each academic year. Committees are constituted to ensure compliance.

Students are expected to adhere to the Rules and Regulations, failing which they will be subjected to disciplinary action. Students must also identify a local guardian who can be contacted in case of any emergency.

All the day-to-day activities are to be managed by the students themselves through any committees necessary for maintaining discipline, planning meals, or other activities. At the beginning of every academic year, students may be elected to the committees. This will enable students to gain valuable organizational skills. The kitchen will serve vegetarian food on all days and non-vegetarian food on designated days.

The residents are not permitted to leave campus without permission and are not allowed to stay outside their Halls of Residence, after specified hours. Keeping four/two-wheelers on campus is not permitted.

The University reserves the right to refuse admission into the Halls of Residence to students who refuse to abide by the Rules and Regulations.

The Wardens/Assistant Wardens of the girls' and boys' hostels may be approached at any time.

FACILITIES

Academic

i. Learning Resource Centre

Note to the Students:

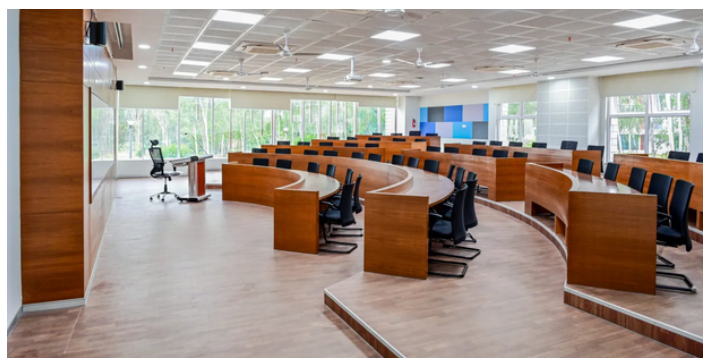
The University expects the students to be highly focused on academics and make maximum use of the facilities available for holistic development. Exams will be conducted periodically.
